

Fair Processing of Personal Data



Performance of a contract

Where personal data is to be processed to fulfil an agreement or service.



Consent

Where an individual has given clear permission for their personal data to be processed, e.g. parents consenting for their children's photos to be used on the club website or social media.



Legitimate interest

Personal data may be processed where this is necessary for legitimate interests of the sports body (e.g., maintaining membership) provided the processing doesn't override the rights and freedoms of members or other people whose data may be processed.



Compliance with a legal obligation

Where the law requires personal data to be processed, e.g. in line with the National Vetting Bureau (Children and Vulnerable Persons) Act 2012



Public interest

Where personal data is processed as part of official duties of the club in the public interest. N.B.: this applies only to public bodies and is highly unlikely to be relevant to sports clubs and organisations.



Vital interest

Where processing of personal data is necessary to protect a player's safety. e.g. the club shares a member's medical details with a paramedic in an emergency.
